Lanskey's Gavin Shaw CA on The Stokehouse Green Star Project in Victoria made a submission for 3 credits for the Life cycles for Concrete. Gavin and this Project Team can be very proud achieving such a great result by exceeding the GreenStar bench mark in all three disciplines. The Three Disciplines:


- 40% Reduction in the use of Portland Cement, with a bench mark of 44%.
- 50% Recycled Water with a total of 91% being used.
- 25% Fine Aggregate Replacement, hitting 25.59%, this was quiet challenging but was delivered using an 80% reduction of fine aggregates in the final concrete pours.

UPDATE on the Northline Project in SA from PM, Rob Ellis

The adverse weather experienced in South Australia during the second half of 2016 was historically bad and prevented any kind of start on the Northline Project.

Add to that Northline's current lease on their existing premises had to be re-negotiated due to weather delays and resulted in a caveat with17 May, 2017 becoming the 'drop dead date' with no further extension possible. While mid May was the target PC date - Lanskey currently has E.O.Ts approved till the first week in July - requiring the project to be accelerated 8 weeks! Swamped under water - the weather finally broke in December allowing construction to commence.

With kick off on December 5, the 3 weeks leading up to Christmas witnessed: 50% of all pad footings cast, In ground infrastructure works complete to office area and North end of site, Office slab cast, First 4 bays of structural steel erected, Remediation to the eastern pavement well underway.

DEC 5 - DEC 22, 2016

3 Weeks post Christmas:

- Completion of Structural Steel erection
- Office area roof installed
- Set out and framing of office internally commenced



- 25% of main roof area installed
- · All precast panels installed
- · Northern end pavements being formed
- · Fire main hung inside main warehouse
- 50% of in ground infrastructure complete
- Complete remediation of eastern and southern pavements due to water damage JAN 9 JAN 23, 2017

With works to the main building progressing at pace - a concentrated effort will now commence to all external pavement areas. Due to the extensive loads that will be applied to these pavements (100t axle loads) These pavements are a combination of conventional slabs and combie fibre slabs incorporating 4D & 5D fibres with the eastern pavements being a fully restrained - 6000m2 joint less slab.
